News from the Lafayette Community Edible Garden

What the Heck is Hemp!

At our September 9th potluck dinner meeting, we will explore hemp production in our area and the products produced by it. Our speaker, Nicolette Slagle, has grown hemp with Winona LaDuke of the White Earth Nation for several years. She is now a licensed hemp grower, and more recently, Nicolette has been making hemp products such as salves for friends and family and for personal use.

"'What started out as a small operation has now grown into two locations of hemp crops.' She [Slagle] estimates that she has fewer than 300 hemp plants growing in Minnesota. . . Her long-term hope is to launch a destination dispensary." (Duluth News Tribune, 8/12/19)

Nicolette is the Research Director for Honor the Earth, and she is currently involved with promoting the Rights of Nature, a movement in the United States and abroad to recognize legally enforceable rights for ecosystems, such as the adoption of a rights of nature law within the City of Duluth that would protect wild rice (manoomin) and the St. Louis Estuary.

Old Business -



Park Point Summer Youth Program 2019

Year – end Summary

The Summer Youth Program held at Lafayette Square and sponsored by the Park Point Community Club ended on August 8 after nine weeks of summer activities. The returning staff included Program Co-Directors, Kevin and Karen with new Assistant Director Chris, who led the campers through an active and learning summer. This year 37 children (18 from Park Point) attended the Program. Many attended for a limited number of weeks while 23 attended full-time. The average age was eight. This year we had two full – time interns, Mallory and Edward, and volunteers, Isaac, Jack and Louisa, who assisted the staff allowing the group to divide into 3 (Sprouts, Tweeners and Cadets) by age groups for different activities. The interns and volunteers are former campers and donated over 700 hours while gaining experience in camp coordination.

The Program featured a variety of field trips including bowling, a movie, the Aquarium, Maker Space, the Trampoline Park, golfing, a tour of two organic farms in Wrenshall, the Zoo, the library, UMD Tweed Museum and Planetarium. Cadets had a few bike rides going to the Folk School, the Rose Garden and Maker Space. The campers enjoyed many beach days with the warm water this year and earned 2nd Place at the YMCA Sand building Contest. The kids held a beach sweep and played bingo at the Franciscan Nursing Home with residents. They enjoyed many veggies in the garden joining the Community Edible Garden Club on Mondays. On the Point they toured the airport, the rowing club, had a day of tubing, sailing and paddle boarding. They also learned Pickle Ball this year as well as played 'water works' at the playground, tennis, and tetherball. On cloudy days they built Lego structures, played Foosball, painted and made crafts. Science kits were a weekly educational feature from the Aquarium. The summer wrapped up with the Olympic competition offering campers a multitude of events. On the last day, scenes from Aladdin and Snow White were performed, unique Elite Camper Awards presented and a camp video during a family Bar B Que.

A survey of grandparents and parents indicated that the 2019 Program was positive with campers enjoying the varied experiences at PPSYP and parents supporting the communication and attention campers receive. The majority thought the fee was reasonable and 100% would or might register their camper next year.

Thank you to the Community Edible Garden Club and the Park Point Community Club, especially the officers for their support and assistance for a successful program. Thank you also to the parents and grandparents and children for participating and all the supporters who provided exciting field trips and activities.
