Fairwell Summer... And Tourists!



The **Duluth Rowing Club** wrapped up both the sprint racing and junior rowing season, August 18 and 19 at the North West International Rowing Association championship regatta in Kenora, Ontario. This year's NWIRA's had a record 531 athletes in the junior, open, master's divisions. The DRC had 25 juniors and 10 masters compete. While Minneapolis won the total point overall trophy (Lipton Cup), the DRC had some podium finishes in both sculling and sweeping divisions.

Park Pointers Greg Peterson and Tom Rauschenfels won gold in the master men's double and 3rd in the master men's pair, then combined with Randy Newberg and Arvid Brekke for a 2nd place finish in the master men's quad and a 3rd in the master men's four. Unfortunately, the high winds and big waves came up in the afternoon of the last day, so that some of the women's final events were canceled.

Duluth Rowing will host the annual "Death Row" 27 kilometer row up the St. Louis River on Sunday, September 17, starting time 8:00 am. Kayaks and canoes will shove off at 7:00. All are welcome to join in the fun.

Many thanks to Pointers for the hospitality shown to the rowing community. This year saw three Learn To Row sessions and one Refresher session with the teaching, coaching, and experiences passed on to about 40 new rowers. Rowers hope to be able to access either the bay or lake side of the Point through the end of October, weather permitting!

News from the Lafayette Community Edible Garden

It's harvest time and in August we picked raspberries, summer squash, potatoes, onions, cucumbers, beans, garlic and loads of herbs. As of mid-August, the tomatoes were finally starting to ripen. Our potluck gatherings have been resplendent with the garden's bounty. Highlights of the August potluck dinner included Charlene Shimmin's mashed rutabaga and potato swirl, Deb McLaughlin's curried pumpkin flatbread garnished with garden greens, and Cheryl Dartanyan's sour cherry almond bread.

Melissa King encourages the group to meet each Saturday at 10:00 A.M. on a regular basis for garden work. More helpers make the work quicker and easier. From now on it will be trimming, cleaning beds for winter & general cleanup.

Ellie Alspach reports. "Don't pick winter squash, or pumpkins until notified. They won't be ready until September or October. The same is true for leeks and Brussel sprouts. They are late summer/fall items."

Coral McDonnell says, "I recently read and also heard several years ago that this is the time of year that we should cut the tops off the tall tomato plants so energy can go to ripening tomatoes rather than starting new ones. Also, if we cut back the chive plants, they will regrow and give us fresh chives."

Julie Calligure shares her success with collard greens, "They should be gathered like a bouquet and cut at the stem right below the leaves. I'm experimenting with freezing some after washing and cutting the middle stem away and then the leaves in 1-2 inch pieces. Collards do not decrease like spinach so they should be cut to bite size. The green leaves are vitamin-rich and delicious. The stems are somewhat ok raw but bitter cooked. I just toss them in the compost."

Cheryl Dartanyan's Sour Cherry Almond Bread

This was served at our August potluck dinner. Cheryl gleaned the recipe from Pinterest. She used sour cherries in the recipe and everyone loved it!

Cup slivered almonds
¼ Cup flour
teaspoon baking powder
teaspoon salt
Cup unsalted butter softened
4 Cup sugar
large eggs ½ teaspoon almond extract
Cups pitted cherries, cut into quarters

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Grease an 8x5 inch loaf pan. Combine dry ingredients in a small bowl and set aside. Mix butter and sugar together until light and fluffy, add eggs, one at a time. Add almond extract, slowly add the dry mixture. Fold in the cherries. Spoon mixture into prepared pan. Bake for one hour, cover lightly with foil if browning too quickly. Let cool 10 minutes prior to removing from loaf pan. -Susan Peters

Park Point Bus Service

With the **Better Bus Blueprint** launching on August 27th, Park Point residents are poised to see an increase in transit quality.

Weekday service will see an increase in hours of service with the last trip leaving downtown at 7:45 pm as opposed to

6:10 pm currently. For those traveling on the weekend, Saturday and Sunday will now have 15 trips a day, whereas Saturday only has 5 trips and Sunday has no service today. Connections between popular destinations around the Twin Ports from Park Point will be much more convenient. Direct, one-seat rides from Park Point to UMD, with a short stop at

the Duluth Transportation Center (DTC) are among the many benefits. Connections to other routes at the DTC will be more convenient with more buses running to popular destinations.

Along with the new service, new bus stop signage is being installed throughout the Twin Ports. The bus stop changes are happening over the next few months. Each bus stop will now have a unique ID number where you can text that ID number to (218)275-5490 to get a real-time update on where

your bus is. It's a great way to know where your bus is, especially if it's running late in a snowstorm or if the bus got bridged.

The DTA is encouraging community members to explore the new bus system by offering **free rides** for the first two weeks of the new service - August 27th to September 9th.



MP50 Minnesota Point Long-Range Resiliency Planning



MP50 Vision: MP50 submitted a Letter of Intent (LOI) for a \$1 million NOAA Climate Resilience Challenge Grant on Aug. 27, 2023. The LOI, approved by the MP50 working group, includes the following vision for MP50:

We envision activating a broad coalition of Minnesota-Wisconsin Point stakeholders into a long-term, self-governed organization that sets long-range resiliency goals, identifies solutions, procures funding, oversees actions, monitors progress, and adapts the strategies over time to meet changing needs.

Meeting with the City of Superior and Wisconsin DNR:

Dawn Buck, Paul Treuer, and Julie McDonnell met with Linda Cadotte, Director of Parks, Recreation & Forestry, City of Superior, and David Grandmaison, Wisconsin DNR Tuesday, Aug. 8th. Agreement was reached to collaborate on resilience efforts for Minnesota-Wisconsin Point.

Minnesota Point Preservation Society (MPPS), will lead fundraising efforts for MP50: MPPS is a non-profit 501c3 for Park Point Community Club. We appreciate the efforts of the founders and current MPPS board members, Gary Glass, Dave Poulin, Rory Strange, and Al Robins who have kept this organization active for many years. New MPPS board members are now being sought who will work together to seek funding for MP50.
